- 1) Playground Live Oak** has the perfect horizontal limb to climb at Cape Story Park, 2235 Bayberry St
- 2) Shady Magical Live Oak** tunnels formed by limbs over the Cape Henry Trail magically keep us cool in summer! Find Live Oak tunnels near cross streets of Bayberry, Maple and other places on this public walking/biking trail.
- 3) North End Live Oak** is an amazing 24 ft circumference. See it in the front yard of 222 77th St.
- 4) Two Miracle Live Oaks** on Shore Dr. were saved from a construction project by neighbors. FOLO requested that Virginia Beach City enclose them in a temporary chain link fence to protect from construction damage. Located on the corner of Page Ave. and Shore Dr.
- 5) Jefferson Live Oaks** are located on Jefferson Blvd, traditionally decorated by neighbors as a spooky ghostly tunnel during the month of October. Featured in the landscapes of many homes, you can see mature Live Oaks throughout the Ocean Park neighborhood.
- 6) Missing Live Oaks** were clear cut in 2025 from Pleasure House Point for a mitigation bank project. Sixty five Live Oaks and a maritime forest are now just a memory. Site may be viewed from the sidewalk near the Marlin Bay Dr. parking lot of the Brock Environmental Center at Pleasure House Point Natural Area.
- 7) Students Live Oak Grove** was planted by FOLO in 2026 as a living commemoration of the student volunteers from the Environmental Studies Program (ESP) who counted 5,214 trees before they were destroyed during the Virginia Beach City Pleasure House Point Wetland Mitigation Project. This grove of saplings from the FOLO nursery may be viewed from the upper deck near the windmill by the corner of the Brock Environmental Center's Lester Educational building, or by walking down the path next to the building. Just before the Crab Creek dock where the Oyster Barge is tied, turn onto the left path to see the saplings. They are supported by wooden stakes.
- 8) Hero Live Oak** was saved by community heroes who petitioned to preserve the maritime forest of Pleasure House Point. This large Live Oak at a public walking trailhead on Marlin Bay Dr. was the only tree preserved. Find it at the second trail entrance from Shore Dr. on Marlin Bay Dr.
- 9) Treasure Live Oak** is a jewel of the neighborhood at the corner of Treasure Island Dr. and Sea Chest Dr. This Live Oak is located on private property and may be viewed from the street.
- 10) "Mini" Live Oak** at 5244 Locke Ln. is 20 ft in circumference and is the oldest Live Oak in Virginia Beach. It is protected by deed, enclosed in a fenced backyard. View it from E. Fox Grove Ct. cul de sac.
